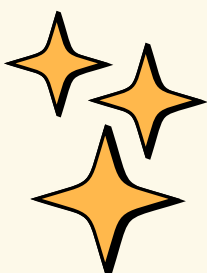

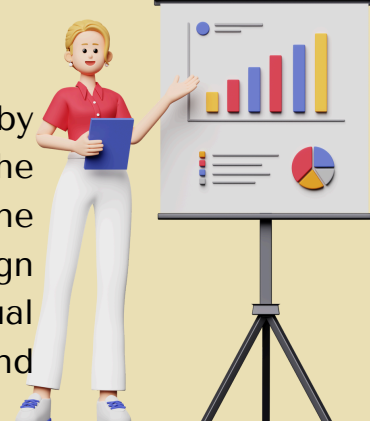


Moral Dilemmas: what solutions would you suggest?



The Student Council
